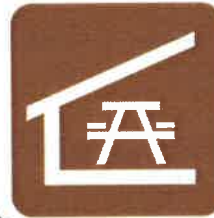

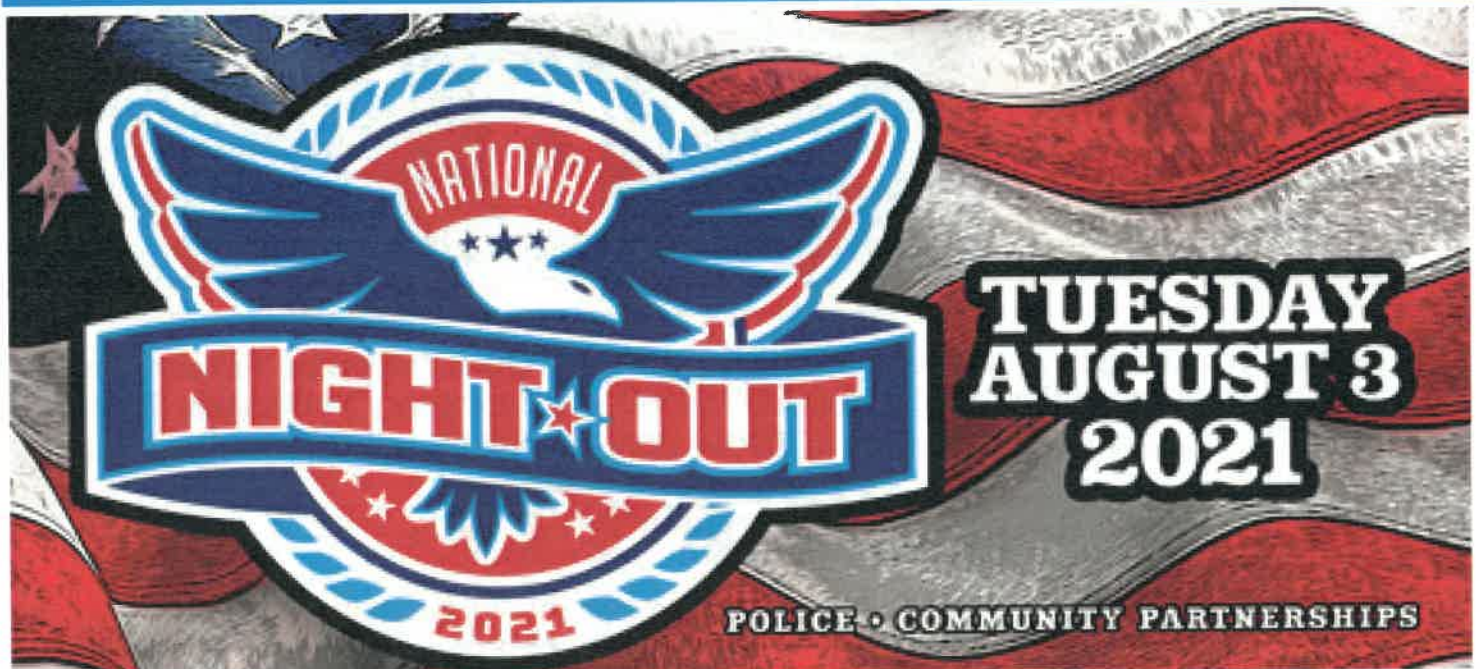
Perry County Downtown Revitalization planning meetings are back on schedule and coming up soon.

The event will be held July 30 thru August 1, 2021 at the Historic Clark's Ferry Tavern
located at 603 N. Market St in Duncannon

This year will feature the first all-out full reunion schedule since the COVID-19 Pandemic began. The 3-day event will include historical presentations, on site Bucktail Museum, a Bucktail Wedding, parade, raffles, and collector tee shirts!

As a special treat, we will be operating the Tavern as well, this will be an historic operation in its own right. Additionally, we will have a special presentation by the National Registry of Historical Places honoring the site.

As many of you are aware the Tavern served as 1 of the 2 Bucktail Recruiting stations in the Duncannon Area during the Civil War. The tavern is in a state of restoration and all funds raised from the reunion will be donated directly back to the historical society to aid in the restoration!! We all strive to preserve history, tell their stories and share the history of as many of the old Boys as we can and this is an excellent opportunity for all of us to make a huge impact on the future of the tavern!! The reunion will be kicked off around the camp fire **Friday night for the Reenactors and Invited guests ONLY.**
