
March 5<sup>th</sup> - Come to the Middle Creek Wildlife Management Area as we learn about and observe the migration of thousands of Snow Geese and Tundra Swans at this important way station. Then hike an average paced 6 mile hike over moderate to strenuous terrain on a series of trails that form a loop back to the visitor's center. There are 2 climbs ranging from 300 to 400 ft. Meet at the Penn Dot parking lot at the Summerdale Mall (429 N. Enola RD, Enola) at 8:00am. (I will be driving a white Highlander.) 
