

INFRASTRUCTURE NEWS

Once again, the Borough had to institute Mandatory Water Restrictions.

This was due to increased water use, 2 line leaks, and low levels in our wells. We would like to thank all who have endeavored to reduce water usage. Remember that water is a precious resource. We should at all times try to conserve. The Borough is constantly looking at options to increase our water reserves.

In the near future, we will be replacing the Ann Street water main to Market Street. We will also be installing permanent leak detection improvements. New water meters are also being installed in all homes in the Borough. Please help out when you are called to set up your meter replacement. We are willing to work with residents to set up a convenient time, even if you are not home during regular working hours.

Hop Aboard rabbittransit Shared Ride

Getting around shouldn't be a challenge! Whether you want to run errands, attend medical appointments, join recreational activities, or visit friends, there's an easy way to get there: Book a Shared Ride with rabbittransit.

Unlike a scheduled bus route that only operates in one area, Shared Ride (a.k.a. Paratransit) provides consolidated trips between travel origins and destinations during limited hours and specific areas.

All Shared Ride trips require a reservation. If you would like sameday service, you must make your reservation by 1:30 p.m. Otherwise, reservations must be made no later than 12:00 p.m. the business day before your ride. Reservations may be made two weeks in advance. For trips on Saturday, Sunday or Monday, reservations must be submitted by 12 p.m. the Friday before. Visit www.rabbittransit.org > Shared Ride > Reservations to schedule a reservation.

When making a reservation for Shared Ride, it's essential to plan accordingly since the service accommodates other passengers' travel plans. Riders are grouped together based on their travel time and location(s). Travel times may be shorter or longer, depending on the total number of riders at the time. While ride times may vary, Shared Ride is a reliable and safe transportation option that can give you peace of mind when accessing life-sustaining

If Shared Ride sounds like a fit for you, the first step is to submit an application to the program you'd like to participate in. Shared Ride programs vary from Senior Shared Ride to the Medical Assistance Transportation Program (MATP), ADA Complementary Paratransit Program (ÁDA), or Paratransit Full Fare. Chapter 225. ZONING

Article XIV. Signs

§ 225-104. Placement, design and illumination of signs.

A. No sign shall be placed within a public street, alley, or right-of-way or attached to a rock, tree or shrub, utility pole, parking meter, traffic signpost, traffic signal, street sign, or historical marker, except directional signs for institutions, such as Borough Offices, churches, parks, etc.
