CHAPTER 130 of the Borough Code GRASS, WEEDS, & OTHER VEGETATION

No person, firm or corporation owning or occupying any property within the Borough of Duncannon shall permit any grass or weeds or any vegetation whatsoever, not edible or planted for some useful or ornamental purpose, to grow or remain upon such premises so as to exceed a height of nine inches. Any grass, weeds or other vegetation growing upon any premises in the Borough in violation of any of the provisions of this section is hereby declared to be a nuisance and detrimental to the health, safety, cleanliness and comfort of the inhabitants of the Borough.

INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATE

I'm sure you have noticed the recent construction activity on much of High Street in the past few months. This was a water main replacement project. It was a long process, and I would like to thank all of those affected for their patience. The street has not been fully paved, because work still needs to be done on our storm drains. A new water main project will begin on Ann Street in the near future.

For the last number of years, Borough Council has applied for and received hundreds of thousands of dollars in Grant funding for these projects. This is our tax money coming back to our town.

In the future, we will be replacing water mains, storm drains, and sewer lines. These projects will improve our town and our property values. So, please know that we are working to make long-term improvements to Duncannon, but these things take time. Thank you for your understanding as we move forward.
