



The first day of winter in the Northern Hemisphere is marked by the winter solstice, which occurs on Thursday, December 21, 2023, at 10:27 P.M. EST.

For the northern half of Earth (the Northern Hemisphere), the winter solstice occurs annually on December 21 or 22. (The Southern Hemisphere's winter solstice occurs in June.) The winter solstice is the day with the fewest hours of sunlight throughout the year, making it the "shortest day" of the year. Thankfully, after we reach the winter solstice, the days begin to grow longer and longer again until we reach the first day of summer and the longest day of the year.

rabbittransit Shared Ride Travel Tips





Cooler weather season is here, so how do you plan to travel and beat the chill? Whether you want to run errands, attend medical appointments, join recreational activities, or visit friends, there's an easy (and warm!) way to get there: Book a Shared Ride with rabbittransit.

Unlike a scheduled bus route that only operates in one area, Shared Ride (a.k.a. Paratransit) provides consolidated trips between travel origins and destinations during limited hours and specific areas.

All Shared Ride trips require a reservation. If you would like same-day service, you must make your reservation by 1:30 p.m. Otherwise, reservations must be made no later than 12:00 p.m. the business day before your ride. Reservations may be made two weeks in advance. For trips on Saturday, Sunday or Monday, reservations must be submitted by 12 p.m. the Friday before. Visit www.rabbittransit.org > Shared Ride > Reservations to schedule a reservation.

Here are some other tips for traveling with rabbittransit in cold or inclement weather conditions:

Plan Ahead: Extreme winter weather may cause delays in Shared Ride service, so please plan ahead and allow extra time for travel. This is especially important if you're making a new trip or one you are not completely familiar with. While ride times may vary, Shared Ride is a reliable and safe transportation option that can give you peace of mind when accessing life-sustaining services. If you need to update or cancel a trip, use the FindMyRide website, or call our Customer Service Center at 1-800-632-9063.

Dress Warmby: Remember to dress for winter conditions Cold air may enter the vehicles.

Dress Warmly: Remember to dress for winter conditions. Cold air may enter the vehicles during the loading and unloading process, especially on windy days.

Step Carefully: Bus floors and steps may become slippery from snow & ice. Kick the snow from your shoes before stepping on board. Use the handrails and take your time.

Stay Informed: In case of inclement weather, rabbittransit may have delays. Sign up for rider alerts and receive an email, text message or phone call about unexpected service changes.

If Shared Ride sounds like a fit for you, the first step is to submit an application to the program you'd like to participate in. Shared Ride programs vary from Senior Shared Ride to the Medical Assistance Transportation Program (MATP), ADA Complementary Paratransit Program (ADA), or Paratransit Full Fare. Riders in select programs may be eligible for free fares. Easily apply online by visiting www.rabbittransit.org > Shared Ride > How to apply. Ordinance §180— SNOW REMOVAL FROM SIDEWALKS

§ 180-8 The owner, occupant or tenant of every property abutting upon or alongside any street or alley in the Borough of Duncannon is hereby required to remove or cause to be removed from all of the sidewalks in front of, alongside or abutting upon such property all snow and ice thereon fallen or formed within 12 daylight hours after such snow and/or ice shall have ceased to fall or to be formed, provided that the owner of a property shall be responsible for conforming to the requirements of this section where such property shall be occupied by the owner, shall be vacant or unoccupied, or shall be a multiple-unit property having more than one tenanted or tenantable unit; and the tenant or occupier of a property shall be so responsible where such property is a single-unit property, occupied by such tenant or occupier only.

§180-9 In any case where the owner, occupant or tenant, as aforesaid, shall fail, neglect or refuse to comply with the provisions of § 180-8 of this article within the time limit prescribed therein, the Borough authorities may proceed immediately to clear all snow and/or ice from the sidewalk of such delinquent and to collect the expenses thereof, with an additional amount of 10% thereof, from such owner, occupant or tenant, as the case may be, which

may be in addition to any fine or penalty imposed under § 180-10 of this article.

§ 180-10 Any owner, occupant or tenant who fails to remove any snow and/or ice from the sidewalk as required by § 180-8 of this article shall be guilty of an offense, and, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100, and costs of prosecution, and, in default of payment of fine and costs, to undergo imprisonment for not more than 10 days. Provided: such fine and costs may be in addition to any expenses and additional amounts imposed as provided in § 180-10 of this article.



SNOW EMERGENCY ROUTES

During a Snow Emergency, it is illegal to park on any designated Snow Emergency Routes. All Snow Emergency Routes are posted.

Violators will be towed at the owner's expense. Tickets will also be issued, with fines of up to \$50, plus costs.

Large Item Pick-up Available



The Duncannon Borough offers special pick-up of large and bulky items for a set fee. You must call in advance to schedule a pick-up. Items placed curb-side without a scheduled pick-up will not be taken. You can schedule a large item pick-up or inquire about pricing by calling the Borough Office at 717-834-4311.

The Borough WILL NOT take electronics or anything with refrigerants.

LIHEAP, the LOW INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM is now OPEN!



The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) helps families living on low incomes pay their heating bills in the form of a cash grant. Households in immediate danger of being without heat can also qualify for crisis grants. The cash grant is a one-time payment sent directly to the utility company/fuel provider to be credited on your bill. These grants range from \$300 to \$1,000 based on household size, income, and fuel type. Remember: This is a grant and does not have to be repaid.

How to apply

There are two ways to apply for LIHEAP:

Online: Apply for benefits online using <u>COMPASS</u>, the online tool for Pennsylvanians to apply for health and human service programs and manage benefit information.

On paper: You can download a paper application, print it, fill it out, and return it to your <u>local county</u> <u>assistance office</u>.
