We are all in this together

As members of our community it is our responsibility to follow the rules set up to keep our Borough as safe and clean as possible. To this end, a street sweeping routine is in effect to remove materials that collect on our streets. These materials can clog storm drains, causing possible street flooding. In addition to increasing the possibility of street flooding, the materials are a safety hazard for cars. The safety issue is especially concerning for people on motorcycles, bicycles and in some cases pedestrians because of the increased chance of sliding on the material that can build up along the streets.

LAND TO THE PARTY OF THE PARTY

The Duncannon Borough Streets department has established a street sweeping routine and will do their utmost to adhere to this schedule. The street sweeping endeavor is influenced by weather (like last summer's water restriction), equipment and staff availability. The Borough realizes that in the past, street sweeping has at times been sporadic. Measures have been taken to normalize the situation. The Borough will street sweep when conditions are appropriate and the staffing is

available.

So, please, for the safety of all involved, yours, your Duncannon neighbors and the Borough Streets dept., move your car when it's your side of the street that's set to be cleaned. I have found that many times throughout life that it is best to "error on the side of caution". This advice has kept me from potential trips to the ER on many occasions and will keep you from getting parking tickets in the future on street sweeping days.

WATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS

A SHARE THE STATE OF THE STATE OF

In late June or early July, the Borough will be replacing a water main on Ann Street. The project will cover Ann St. from where it meets Cumberland St. to Market Street. Shortly after that project is complete, we will begin refurbishment of our standpipe at Cooper Field. These 2 projects are partially paid for by grants and low interest loans from PENNVEST. This money is made available by the Federal Governments Infrastructure and Recovery Act. Our money is coming back to our town.

During these two projects we are asking our residents to conserve water. If we do not, we may have to put mandatory restrictions in place. We would prefer not to have to take that action. If we all conserve a little, it will be a big help and make completion of these projects go more smoothly. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

All recyclables should be clean and all containers should be crushed.

Glass, Books, Electronics,
Batteries, Light Bulbs, Styrofoam,
Other metal, Dirty items,
Non-Recyclable Items.
