The Duncannon Borough offers special pick-up of large and bulky items for a set fee. You must call in advance to schedule a pick-up. Items placed curbside without a scheduled pick-up will not be taken. You can schedule a large item pick-up or inquire about pricing by calling the Borough Office at 717-834-4311.

The Borough **WILL NOT** take electronics or anything with refrigerants.



Recycling is the second Saturday of each month!

Drop-off center on Watershed

Drive will operate from 8am - 10am. You will be asked for identification as proof of residency when dropping off recyclables. The Boy Scouts will continue to offer curbside pickup at 8am in the Borough.

The following items can be placed together in a bag or box:

- Steel cans
- Aluminum (cat food, foil)
- Plastics (identified with #)
- Paper (junk mail, ads, etc.)

The following items must be separated:

- Aluminum beverage cans
- Newspapers - tied or in paper bags
- Cardboard

All recyclables should be clean and all containers should be crushed.

The following items will NOT be accepted:

- Glass, Books, Electronics,
- Batteries, Light Bulbs, Styrofoam,
- Other metal, Dirty items,
- Non-Recyclable Items.

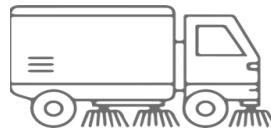
The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has recently updated the Lead and Copper Rule for community drinking water, requiring municipalities to identify and document the materials of water service lines for all properties connected to the public water distribution system. To comply with these regulations, the Borough of Duncannon is completing a survey of all properties served by our water system. As part of this effort, residents are asked to help identify the material of the service line at their property by completing a brief test. We kindly request that residents fill out the survey included with this newsletter, complete the digital survey, or visit the Borough office to complete the form in person within 10 days. If you have branches for chipping, call the Borough Office at 717-834-4311 for scheduling. Our crew takes the chipper out approximately every two weeks as time permits.

Chippable materials should be separated from smaller pieces and leaves. These smaller items should be bundled or bagged for separate pick-up.

Leaf Collection

The Duncannon Borough will be collecting leaves on Monday's, following the street sweeping schedule for Market and High Streets. Other pick-up days will be added as time becomes available

Residents having leaves ready for pick-up in other areas should call the Borough Office at 717-834-4311 so that we can add you to the schedule. Thank you!

IMPORTANT INFORMATION Regarding Refuse Collection

- Each refuse customer is limited to four, 33-gallon capacity containers (no heavier than 40lbs. when full), additional bags will accrue an additional charge.
- Trash containers larger than 33-gallon capacity or over 40lbs. **WILL NOT** be picked up. The larger containers are meant for an automated trash truck and are too large and heavy for manual pick-up.
- Trash should be curbside by 7:00 AM on your scheduled collection day. Containers should not be put out more than 24 hours in advance of collection.
 - Trash must be placed securely in bags, not loose in the trash container. Loose trash **WILL NOT** be collected.

Chapter 225. ZONING

Article XIV. Signs

§ 225-104. Placement, design and illumination of signs.

A. No sign shall be placed within a public street, alley, or right-of-way or attached to a rock, tree or shrub, utility pole, parking meter, traffic signpost, traffic signal, street sign, or historical marker, except directional signs for institutions, such as Borough Offices, churches, parks, etc.
