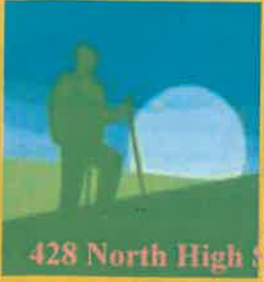

Safer Streets For All

Duncannon Borough has embarked on a plan to systematically address safety issues with multi-modal users of our Borough streets. Earlier in the Fall, the Borough Council worked with many local and some not so local municipalities to write a "Traffic Calming Policy" for the Borough. This draft Traffic Calming Policy was recently sent to PennDOT for review and recommendations. Once this is formalized and accepted, it will be a guiding document for moving forward in the Borough. In addition to the policy, representatives from the Borough Council held an initial meeting with key representatives of PennDOT's LTAP (Local Technical Assistance Program) Engineer, TCRPC (Tri-County Regional Planning Commission) Planner, PennDOT Safety Engineer, Federal Highway Administration Safety Engineer, and our Borough Engineer. This meeting was the first step in developing a "Road Safety Audit" (RSA) for the Borough. Part of this RSA is a "Pedestrian Safety Audit" (PSA) which was the focal point of this first meeting. A PSA is a proactive process that provides valid and verifiable optional suggestions which can be implemented to improve safety, in stages, as time and resources permit. The study area of this PSA is Market Street. This draft PSA is being written by PennDOT LTAP members and should be presented for consideration, to the entire Road Safety Audit team, in April of this year.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION Regarding Refuse Collection

- Each refuse customer is limited to four, 33-gallon capacity containers (no heavier than 40lbs. when full), additional bags will accrue an additional charge.
- Trash containers larger than 33-gallon capacity or over 40lbs. **WILL NOT** be picked up. The larger containers are meant for an automated trash truck and are too large and heavy for manual pick-up.
- Trash should be curbside by 7:00 AM on your scheduled collection day. Containers should not be put out more than 24 hours in advance of collection.
- Trash must be placed securely in bags, not loose in the trash container. Loose trash **WILL NOT** be collected.
